

## Flight Instructor Rating (CFI)

The Flight Instructor Syllabus is designed to coordinate the academic study assignments and flight training required by applicants for flight instructor licenses and/or additional ratings. New subject matter is introduced during the ground lessons, which include five items:

1. In-depth textbook assignments
2. DVD presentations
3. Thorough instructor/student discussions
4. Comprehensive review questions
5. Stage and end-of-course exams for evaluation and reinforcement

### Course Objectives

The applicant will obtain the knowledge, skill, and aeronautical experience necessary to meet the requirements of a flight instructor license with an airplane category rating and a single-engine class rating.

### Ground Training Course Objectives

Aeronautical Knowledge 40.0 hours.

The applicant will obtain the necessary aeronautical knowledge, instructional background, and meet the prerequisites specified in Part 61 for the ECAA flight instructor airmen knowledge test.

### Flight Training Course Objectives

The applicant will obtain the aeronautical skill, instructional knowledge, and experience necessary to meet the requirements of a flight instructor license with an airplane category rating and a single-engine class rating.

Flight course 25.0 hours of flight training.

### Written Test:

The applicant must pass a knowledge test with a score of 70% or better. This test is administered at ECAA facility. The test consists of 75 multiple-choice questions.

### Flight Test:

The applicant must successfully complete a practical test, which will be given as a final exam by MFC designated examiner. The MFC designated examiners are proficient, experienced flight instructors who are authorized by the ECAA to conduct flight tests.

### Requirements:

To obtain a flight instructor license the applicant must be at least 18 years of age and be able to read, write, understand, and converse fluently in English. In addition, the applicant must successfully complete all of the ground and flight training lessons contained in Stages I and II.

1. Valid ECAA Commercial Pilot License / Instrument Rating
1. Class I Medical certificate by a ECAA physician
2. All students or applicant required by law to get Security clearance prior to commencing flight training in the A.R.E (MFC will apply for the student's security clearance when all his documents with course application fees are received.)

3. Personal interview with the MFC enrollment committee.
