

The Private Pilot License (PPL) ECAR 141

The Private Pilot Syllabus has been specifically developed to meet the requirements of ECAR Part 141. The syllabus should be considered as an abstract or digest of the course of training. As such, it is important that instructors also refer to the pertinent sections of the regulations during the conduct of the course. This will ensure that all aeronautical knowledge areas, flight proficiency, and experience requirements have been included during flight training and are documented in appropriate records. The terminology for maneuvers and procedures listed in the syllabus aligned with the "tasks" which are published in the ECAA's Private Pilot Practical Test Standards.

Syllabus:

Theory - 92.0 hours of Theoretical Knowledge Private Pilot Book and Cessna 172 ground school.

Flight - 35 hours of flight training including 5 Hours simulated / FTD

- 1- 21 hours of dual training including 3 hours of dual simulated instrument flying training.
- 2- 11 hours of solo including 8.5 hours of navigation
- 3- 3 hours of dual night flying

An average student takes about 35 to 40 hours of flight training. Out of the required minimum of 35 hours including 5 hours FTD.

Written Test

Student must pass a knowledge test with a score of 70% or better. This test is administered at MFC facility. The test consists of 50 multiple-choice questions selected from the Private Pilot Test Bank.

Flight Test

Student must successfully complete a practical test, which will be given as a final exam by MFC designated examiner. The MFC designated examiners are proficient, experienced flight instructors who are authorized by the ECAA to conduct flight tests.

Requirements:

- 1- High School or what is equivalent as a minimum education.
- 2- Good command of the English language (Level 4).
- 3- Minimum age 17 years to be enrolled in the course and 18 years to obtain a license.
- 4- Class II Medical certificate by an ECAA physician.
- 5- All students required by law to get Security clearance prior to commencing flight training in the A.R.E (Misr flying college will apply for your security clearance when all your documents with course application fees are received.)
- 6- Personal interview with the MFC enrolment committee.

Duration:

Approximately 4 - 6 months
